Let's All Be Good Neighbors



Here are some things you can do to make sure you are a good neighbor.

- Un-mowed yards are unsightly and unhealthy. They detract from the quality of life and property values as well as providing safe haven for rats and other vermin. Grass or weeds cannot be higher than 6 inches, so remember to mow your yard before it reaches this height. If high grass and/or weeds are reported at your property, you will receive a letter indicating that you have five days to rectify it. Please keep your yard mowed.
- Trash and debris creates an eyesore, detracts from the quality of life and lowers property values. Accumulations of trash and debris also harbor rats and other rodents. Please keep your yard free of loose trash and debris.
- Barking dogs need to be taken care of. A "rule of thumb" would be after 15 minutes of barking, your neighbors have probably had enough and you need to bring the dog inside.
- When walking dogs, please keep them on a leash and remember to pick up dog waste. Don't leave dog waste on other people's property or public property.
- Junk and inoperable vehicles are a hazard as well as an eyesore and lower property values.

Did you know . . .

- A building permit is required for all construction work including additions, patio covers, carports, fences/walls, accessory buildings like garages, storage sheds, etc.
- A mobile home permit is required for a mobile home to be placed outside of a Mobile Home Park.
- A Special Events Permit is required for an event held on City property that will be open to the public.
- All all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles operated within the corporate limits of the City are required to be registered with the City.
- Registering your bicycle with the City will greatly assist in its recovery if it is stolen.
