ACE Revenue Return to City of Kimball

On February 21, 2017, Beth Ackland, ACE director of retail gas services, presented a check for \$3,773.70 to the City of Kimball as its share of \$200,000 being distributed through ACE's revenue return program to the 72 Nebraska member

communities of the not-for-profit community-owned natural gas supplier. Since forming in 1998, ACE has returned more than \$1.8 million back to its Nebraska members, including \$46,455.23 to Kimball.

In the past, the ACE revenue return has helped pay for a merry-go-round for Gotte Park, LED Christmas lights, banners and flags for the light poles, Cemetery projects, and swimming pool outdoor furniture.
