General Housekeeping Rules

- ◆ Owners are responsible for dog messes & all dogs must have one handler
- ◆ In addition to the big pool, our baby pool will be available for small or nervous dogs. We require that all dogs be willing swimmers. Forcing a nervous or scared dog into the pool will NOT be tolerated.
- ◆ Dogs must be on a leash outside of the water.
- ◆ Handlers will not be allowed in the water unless the dog needs assistance.
